

Mike Krentz writes medical suspense, psychological thrillers, and military women's fiction based on his experiences as an emergency physician and US Navy medical officer.

Born and raised in Arizona, Mike earned a classical degree in English from the University of San Francisco, a Doctor of Medicine degree from the Medical College of Wisconsin, and a Master of Public Health Degree from Johns Hopkins University.

Following a civilian career as an emergency physician, Mike rededicated his professional life to serve America's Navy and Marine Corps heroes and their families. His last active-duty assignment was as Seventh Fleet Surgeon on board the USS *Blue Ridge*, based in Yokosuka, Japan.

After retiring from the US Navy, Mike continued his service as a consultant to the Navy and Marine Corps Public Health Center, Health Analysis Department. Upon completion of that mission, he returned to his earliest life passion as a full-time writer.

Mike sits on the Board of Directors of The Muse Writers Center, where he also teaches fiction writing and leads an advanced fiction studio. Mike is a member of Hampton Roads Writers and Military Writers of America.

Mike, his wife Kathryn, and miniature schnauzer Yoshi live in Norfolk, VA.

Mike's Dr. Zack Winston Series of medical conspiracy thrillers transports the reader into the stressful environment of emergency medicine, where life battles death amid terrified screams, plaintive whimpers, and shouted orders; where fallible humans strive to postpone death, restore life, or eliminate misery. These would-be heroes sometimes fail. They suck it up and move on to quiet a frightened child, relieve pain, straighten a broken limb, repair a laceration, or reassure the worried well. What evil might lurk amid such chaos?

The first book in the series, <u>DEAD ALREADY</u>, launched from TouchPoint Press in 2020.

The second book, WARM AND DEAD, will launch later in 2022.

Mike's psychological thriller, <u>ANGELS FALLING</u>, published from TouchPoint Press January 10, 2022. The ritualistic murder of a Catholic archbishop scrambles the lives of an ex-seminarian criminal profiler, a

renegade priest cult leader, and the former nun they both desired. Shakespeare, Poe, and Donne add commentary.

Mike's MAHONEY & SQUIRE SERIES portrays the lives of servicemen and women, their challenges, and interactions; and their wounds—physical and emotional—that evolve into professional and personal conflicts more daunting than combat. Can essential human relationships survive such brutal demands on hearts and souls?

The first book in this series, HER SHOW OF FORCE, will launch October 3, 2023.

INTERVIEW

WITH MIKE KRENTZ

How did you, a successful emergency physician and naval officer, decide to become a writer?

I've wanted to be a writer since high school English classes. In college, I took the unorthodox route to pre-medical studies by majoring in English and taking the required science classes as electives. My medical and US Navy careers exclusively provided non-fiction opportunities: academic articles, reports, briefings, and such. Near the end of my Navy career, when I was Seventh Fleet Surgeon on board the flagship, USS *Blue Ridge*, a colleague and I talked about writing a TV series about Navy life. That never came about, but the concept morphed into my character-based military novels. After I retired from the Navy, I did some consulting in public health, then took the plunge into writing full-time.

Why did you write **Her Show of Force**?

This novel is an improved second edition of **Riven Dawn**, the first novel in my earlier **Flagship Series**. It started out as a script for a TV pilot. I soon discovered that novel-writing provides a better platform for a character-based story. I can get inside my characters' heads in a way a script cannot. I didn't want to write a shoot-them-up military thriller, but to portray the real-life challenges that military people face, on and off the battlefield—aspects of their humanity that I know well from serving them as a physician. It became a short jump from there to casting Kate Mahoney, a female naval aviator, as my main character. I've seen what it takes for a woman to succeed in naval aviation. She has to double down on the Navy core values of honor, courage, and commitment. The women I was privileged to know in the Navy did just that. Kate Mahoney epitomizes their challenges and conquests, not only in naval air, but throughout the military.

How would you describe the themes of **Her Show of Force**?

The primary theme is reconciliation. The main character, Kate Mahoney, suffers the effects of difficult life events, a traumatic childhood, toxic marriage, troubled teenage son, among others. She's also a rising star in her profession. That provides opportunities, but also challenges, both personal and professional. Another theme is the value of friendship, trust, and vulnerability to one's personal growth. Finally, there's the core theme of good against

evil, truth against lies, life against death; and the frequent difficulty of figuring out which is which.

Will there be a sequel?

Yes. Three, to be exact. The next book, Her Pacific Showdown, should launch after the holidays. It continues Kate's story, and also introduces a new main character, naval aviator Lieutenant Commander Jessica "Cricket" Squire. She faces her own personal and professional challenges.
